Community business donors and volunteer work crews serve Two Rivers homeowners



July 26th was a very full day. Several Two Rivers homeowners, as well as Two Rivers itself, hosted a group of young adults and chaperones for a day of yardwork, painting, and general cleanup of homes and yards. The volunteers were ELCA youth, in town for a convention called "The Boundless Gathering". Organized in partnership with Service Learning Camps, LLC, these young people and adults arrived with enthusiasm and a willingness to get their hands dirty in service to others.

Their hands didn't get too dirty, however, thanks to the generous donations from local businesses. The businesses shown here stepped up when asked and donated water, tools, cleaning and paint supplies...and yes, gloves.

The impact made by the end of the day was visible. The crews worked on a Two Rivers home just finishing rehab and being purchased in September. Two homeowners that are selling received help with readying their homes for new owners, and a third homeowner had assistance with yardwork.

One of the homeowners was happy to allow us to share her appreciative words: "My requested projects were completed to my fullest satisfaction....I was impressed at how friendly and eager to help the volunteers were. I was especially blown away when at the end of their volunteer period they formed a circle and asked if they could pray for my family. I was so touched and grateful for that specific gesture! Wow! Thank you!"

Getting Your Home Ready for Fall...and Winter Home and yard maintenance checklist




It may not even officially be Fall yet. But if you're a Minnesotan, you know that Winter weather can arrive before Halloween. So while you're drinking your pumpkin spice latté and raking your leaves, it's a good idea to add some other chores to the home maintenance list.

Some of those items include:

- Clean out the gutters and downspouts on your home. If you are not comfortable on a ladder, hire someone to do this.
- Change the batteries on your smoke / CO detectors, and test them.
- Change your furnace filter and then keep changing it every 2 months.
- Get your furnace checked by a professional.
- Get your dryer vent (and duct) cleaned. This can often be done by the same company that gives your furnace a tune-up, so you could ask for a discount if you order both services.
- Disconnect, drain and store garden hoses.
- Shut off the main water supply to outside water faucets, and make sure you drain the faucet after! Water remaining in the pipes can freeze, expand and do major damage.
- Install weatherstripping around doors and windows to prevent cold air drafts.

If you have not had any damage to your home from wind, lightning or hail this year, consider yourself very lucky. Or, maybe you should take a look at your roof.

Minnesota received some extremely destructive weather this Spring and Summer. Anyone living here knows that. What everyone may not know is how important it is to **check your home's roof and siding for damage after a storm.**

Damage to a home's exterior, if not replaced or repaired, will leave the home vulnerable to Winter weather and temperatures. Repairs need to happen.

That is what insurance is for. But covering the deductible for a damage claim is expensive as well.

Make sure you plan for the unexpected. Have funds set aside for deductibles that you do not touch for anything else. Then when the roof caves in (let's hope not), your finances don't collapse as well.
