Home Improvement Loan Program Information



As a homeowner, you know the importance of keeping your home in good shape. You likely also know the high cost of many home repairs and upgrades, but it may be too much for your budget when the need arises.

If that is the case, the Home Improvement Loan Program through Washington County is something you should know about. The types of improvements the loan will fund include:

- furnaces
- bathroom and kitchen improvements
- windows
- roofing
- plumbing and electrical upgrades

Loan terms are more than competitive: 0% and deferred to eligible applicants.

Deferred maintenance is the practice of delaying repairs on your property to save money. Understandably, it is sometimes hard to make room in one's budget for home maintenance. However, a needed repair only gets more expensive to fix as time goes by; one problem can lead to another.

Care for your home as if you may be selling it soon. Why? Two reasons:

- You are then able to enjoy all the features of your home as they are meant to be enjoyed.
- If you ever decide to sell your home, you will be responsible for any needed repairs, and the cost will be taken out of your sale proceeds if you do not pay for them outright. (This is stated in the ground lease that you signed when you purchased your home.)

Your home is a huge investment. Protect it and protect your finances by taking good care of it.


An important note about your home insurance policy

- Downspouts Make sure they are empty and connected correctly to direct water away from your home's foundation.
- **Sump pump** Check to make sure it is in working order. You want to know this before you need it!
